Years 11-12

- Promote VET (Cert III and IV) opportunities and associated industry traineeships.
- Assist in linking VET students with industry providers as potential hosts for vocational training placements.
- Opportunities to gain industry experience through non-accredited training.
- Pathways to tertiary education in health and allied health careers.
- Access to resources and workshops on work readiness and employability skills.
- Support existing VET students with *Health Gateway Resource Kits*.
